BON Launches New Webinars on Nursing Peer Review in 2011



The Board of Nursing (BON) will begin offering two new webinars in 2011:

Nursing Peer Review: Understanding the Process and ***Safe Harbor: Ensuring Patient Safety***

Webinars are a powerful and cost-effective way to obtain real time information on the Nursing Peer Review process in the convenience of a nurse's work or home setting. Webinars are live seminars broadcast through an internet – connected computer. The video portion of the webinar is displayed on the computer screen and the audio is offered through teleconferencing. Live broadcasts provide an opportunity for participants to ask questions and dialogue with BON staff. The webinars are inexpensive and designed to reach all nurses in Texas to promote an understanding of the roles nurses, committee chairpersons, committee members, and administrators have in the Nursing Peer Review (NPR) process.

NPR is an important quality improvement mechanism that enhances the care nurses provide to patients. NPR is a process that allows a committee to evaluate nursing services, the qualifications of a nurse, and the quality of care provided to patients. The NPR committee's mission is patient safety and the NPR process often results in important policy changes within practice settings. The NPR process and procedure for invoking Safe Harbor can be challenging. Knowledge of the specific BON Rules and Regulations will help to ensure that the NPR is conducted correctly and fairly.

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Summary of Actions

A regular meeting of the Board of Nursing was held October 21-22, 2010, in Austin. The following is a summary of Board actions taken during this meeting.



In the November 5, 2010, issue of the *Texas Register*, the Texas Board of Nursing (BON) proposed amendments to Chapter 214 - *Vocational Nursing Education*, §§214.2 - 214.9. The proposed amendments are necessary to: (i) clarify definitions within the chapter; (ii) emphasize the importance of faculty supervised, hands-on patient care in clinical practice; (iii) clarify the Board's ability to change a nursing education program's level of approval status; (iv) specify minimum qualifications for vocational nursing educa-

tion program administration and faculty; (v) correct typographical errors; and (vi) eliminate redundant and contradictory language within the chapter.

The BON also proposed amendments to Chapter 215 - *Professional Nursing Education*, §§215.2 - 215.5, 215.8, 215.9. The proposed amendments are necessary to: (i) clarify definitions within the chapter; (ii) emphasize the importance of faculty supervised, hands-on patient care in clinical practice; (iii) clarify the Board's ability to change a

nursing education program's level of approval status; (iv) correct typographical errors; and (v) eliminate redundant and contradictory language within the chapter.

The 30-day comment period for proposed amendments to Chapters 214 and 215 ended on December 6, 2010. No comments were received and amendments to Chapters 214 and 215 were published as adopted in the December 24, 2010, issue of the *Texas Register*, taking effect on December 27, 2010.

Did you know....

Continuing education hours for licensure renewal will need to be in the nurse's area of practice effective October 4, 2010. Some topics, such as ethics, confidentiality, documentation, and nursing law and rules, apply to every area of nursing practice. A nurse may achieve more than the minimum 20 contact hours every licensure renewal cycle or the nurse may achieve, maintain, or renew an approved national nursing certification in the nurse's area of practice.

Nurses On Guard – Best Practice in Patient Safety

Establishing Professional Boundaries in the Community

Nurses in the community provide a wide range of services to patients with challenging and complex health conditions. The services include preventive care, long-term chronic disease management, hospice and palliative care in facilities or home-based settings. Regardless of where nursing services are provided, nurses in the community have seen an increase in acuity levels as patients transition from the hospital back into their home environment. To care for these vulnerable patient populations, nurses often have to establish long-term therapeutic relationships that may last for months or years.

Maintaining professional boundaries is extremely important in nurse-patient relationships that extend over a long period of time. Boundary lines are blurred when nurses become personally involved with patients. Many times when lines are blurred, boundary violations result. Boundary violations occur when nurses do not act in the best interest of patients. Nurses are disciplined for boundary violations when patients are harmed physically, financially, or emotionally.

The National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) defines a nurse's professional boundary as "the space between the nurse's power and the patient's vulnerability". A nurse has access to patients' private information, therefore, the nurse must establish boundaries to manage the power differential in the nurse-patient relationship. The boundary permits a safe connection between nurses and patients in order to meet the patients' health care needs.

When the nurse's only role in the patient care environment is that of caregiver, the nurse must maintain a higher level of objectivity to ensure that professional boundaries are maintained.

An example of a boundary violation is when nurses are both foster parent for a child and the nurse providing care to that child through a home health agency. The nurse may lose his or her objectivity and not act in the best interest of the child by placing either the nurse's needs as foster parent or the employer's requests above the child's needs. The nurse, with a focus on safety, must remain objective as he or she advocates for the needs of the child. Other examples of boundary crossings are when nurses share personal information with patients, such as e-mail, home addresses, or phone numbers; form friendships with patients and visit outside of work hours; run errands for patients; or use patient information for personal gain.

Board staff has seen nurses provide care to a patient and also act as the patient's power of attorney, medical power of attorney, foster parent, or the client's responsible adult (CRA). Because all nurses are required to establish and maintain professional boundaries in their therapeutic relationships with patients, it is not appropriate to be monetarily compensated as the nurse and as the power of attorney, medical power of attorney, foster parent, or CRA. Engaging in these dual roles creates a conflict of interest and is generally considered unprofessional conduct. Boundary violations occur when nurses con-

fuse their patients' needs with their own personal needs.

Nurses have a unique role with their patients in the community and, consequently, must be on guard not to overstep the boundaries of the nurse-patient relationship. This role enables the nurse to become aware of many of the patient's needs. However, the nurse should not become personally involved in matters that do not relate to the plan of care. For instance, it is important to avoid any type of business relationships with patients.

Board staff recommends referring to the following rules:

- **Board Rule 217.11(1) (J) which requires the nurse to know, recognize, and maintain professional boundaries of the nurse-client relationship; and**
- **Board Rule 217.12(6) (D) which defines misconduct as violating professional boundaries of the nurse/client relationship including but not limited to physical, sexual, emotional or financial exploitation of the client or the client's significant other(s); and**
- **Board Rule 213.27(b) (2) (F) requires the nurse to recognize and honor interpersonal boundaries appropriate to the therapeutic relationship or health care setting.**

Texas License Renewal: A Snapshot of Nurses in Texas

This guest article clarifies why it is important to provide complete and accurate information when you renew your nursing license as well as how your renewal information benefits the public and the profession of nursing.

Every two years nurses are required to renew their nursing license through the Texas Board of Nursing (BON). The Health Provider Resource Center and the Texas Center for Nursing Workforce Studies use the licensure data from the BON to analyze and disseminate data concerning demographic and supply trends of nurses in Texas. The individual license renewal process for each nurse takes only a few minutes but has wide-reaching impact.

The data provided by each nurse is used to tell us where we are in regard to the supply for nurses in Texas. It also serves as an important resource for legislators to develop policy measures to address nursing workforce issues.

The data collected in the Texas License Renewal provides crucial information about the trends in the nursing workforce in Texas. In addition, the questions on the Texas Licensure Survey are consistent with standards developed by the Forum of State Nursing Workforce Centers, a group of nursing workforce centers dedicated to addressing issues related to supply and demand for nurses in each state and nationally.

Each question on the Texas License Renewal gives unique information that is not captured anywhere else. For example, it allows us to see whether there are increases in male nurses in Texas or how the racial and ethnic makeup of nurses changes and how it compares to the general Texas population. We are also able to determine important information about the aging workforce such as when different cohorts will be eligible for retirement and how many nurses will be needed to replace them. It also provides data about migration patterns of nurses.

It lets us know where nurses work in Texas and whether they work in the same areas where they live.

Not only do license renewal questions inform us about the geographic location of nurses but also in what settings and positions nurses are employed. Such information allows us to determine how many nurses work in hospitals as staff nurses or how many work in schools of nursing as faculty or educators. We can also ascertain how many currently licensed nurses are actively employed in nursing and how many of these nurses are working full-time or part-time. This data is critical to obtaining accurate supply data. It allows us to estimate how many and in what areas we will need more nurses.

Questions regarding nurses’ educational background such as the location of one’s basic nursing program or highest degree obtained inform decisions about the educational pipeline and provide data about the progression of nurses’ education. Additionally, it enables us to discover the number of nurses licensed in Texas who received their nursing education outside of Texas or the United States. This data is especially important in light of the time, energy and capital spent to increase the production of nurses in Texas.

As can be seen, the Texas License Renewal gives each individual nurse a unique opportunity to help provide a snapshot of the important work they do every day. Please take the time to provide complete and accurate data on each question, even the questions that are optional. The data that is collected will be used to tell us where we are in regards to supply and demand and to help improve the work environment of nurses in Texas.

The Extended Evaluation Program: FAQs

Since its implementation in September, 2007, over 115 RNs and LVNs have entered the Extended Evaluation Program (EEP) and 54 nurses have successfully completed the EEP. Currently, 32 nurses are participating in EEP. Because many nurses are unaware of or misinformed about the program, answers to some of the most frequently asked questions about the EEP are provided.

Q: What is the Extended Evaluation Program (EEP)?

A: The EEP is a voluntary monitoring program designed to help nurses avoid possible disciplinary action by the Texas Board of Nursing (BON) against their nursing licenses by demonstrating that they do not have a drug or alcohol problem. Participants are required to demonstrate one year of abstinence confirmed by random drug testing. EEP is recognized and approved by the BON and is administered by the Texas Nurses Foundation's Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses (TPAPN).

Q: What are the benefits of EEP?

A: EEP offers the nurses and patients of Texas a proactive, systems-based approach for identifying and addressing risks due to potential substance abuse issues when punitive or blaming approaches may more often occur, e.g., termination and possible licensure action. Early identification and monitoring through drug testing within EEP can also result in therapeutic interventions for nurses requiring assessment and treatment so that they may obtain appropriate care and remain contributing members of the nursing profession. These are some of the positive attributes of the Extended Evaluation Program.

Q: What happens to nurses who have an unauthorized, positive drug test while in EEP?

A: "Unauthorized drug test result" means a result in which the nurse did not inform EEP of a legitimate prescription or the drug test reveals an otherwise illicit substance. Through random drug testing, EEP screens participants who may require more rigorous monitoring, i.e., TPAPN. Of the 115 nurses who have signed EEP participation agreements since its inception, 21 or approximately 18% have been identified as having a possible abuse problem as a result of positive drug tests and voluntarily chose to participate in TPAPN – the BON approved program for nurses with substance use disorders and certain psychiatric disorders that may have impaired their practice.

Q: Who is eligible to participate in EEP?

A. Nurses (RNs and LVNs) may only participate with prior approval by the BON. Nurses referred to the BON or TPAPN for a single, identified incident of improper drug or alcohol use, or a positive, unauthorized drug screen result may qualify for EEP if there are no other legal or practice concerns. Additionally, to be eligible, identified/referred nurses must receive a negative evaluation for substance abuse or dependency by a qualified assessor.

Q: What are the costs associated with participation in EEP?

A: Nurses are responsible for the cost of the following:

- 1) An initial evaluation and any subsequent evaluations required (by a qualifying assessor);
- 2) A one-time nonrefundable enrollment fee of \$250 as well as \$59 for each random drug test (typically 1 – 3 times per month).

Q: What other requirements must EEP participants meet?

A: EEP participants must:

- 1) Submit a signed participation agreement and any necessary consent forms;
- 2) Adhere to random drug testing requirements – a minimum of 18 negative drug tests during participation (Participation is 12 months minimum);
- 3) Maintain abstinence from all controlled substances (unauthorized prescription(s) or illicit), over-the-counter (OTC) drugs that can be abused, and alcohol during participation;
- 4) Submit documentation of all current medications, both prescribed and OTC;
- 5) Demonstrate proof of nursing practice for a minimum of 6 months while participating in EEP; and
- 6) Obtain additional drug testing and assessment(s) when requested by EEP. Note: Because no substance abuse or dependency has been identified for the participants of EEP, no volunteer nurse advocates are assigned for support and no self-help meetings, such as Alcoholics Anonymous or Narcotics Anonymous, are required.

Q: How will EEP affect the employment of nurses who participate?

A: Unlike TPAPN, the "return to work agreements" and practice restrictions are not required of nurses in the EEP. Employers of EEP nurses are normally *only* contacted by EEP upon identified noncompliance by EEP participants, e.g., a positive, unauthorized drug screen. Therefore, EEP provides a seamless and confidential process for nurses who have no identified practice violations or substance abuse issues but who agree to be monitored through drug testing while maintaining their nursing employment. Note: Nurses in EEP have no public action on their licenses.

Q: What are the possible grounds for dismissal from EEP?

A: Nurses may be dismissed from EEP due to:

- 1) A positive, unauthorized drug test result;
- 2) An adulterated or diluted specimen or missed drug test;
- 3) Receipt of a third-party report or self-admission that indicates a possible practice violation; and
- 4) Failure to adhere to any EEP terms of participation.

Nurses dismissed from EEP are either reported to the BON for investigation or, with the BON's approval, processed into

TPAPN to continue the monitoring process while initiating treatment/recovery for an identified substance use disorder.

Q: What happens to nurses who successfully complete EEP?

A: Nurses successfully completing EEP:

- 1) Receive official notification of completion from their EEP case manager.
- 2) The BON is notified of completion; and
- 3) Through participation in EEP nurses can continue to move forward in their nursing career, having satisfactorily completed a non-punitive course of action and avoid the possibility of substance use disorders impacting their nursing practice.

The following quote (in *italics*) is from an email received by the EEP case manager of a nurse who recently completed the program. The correspondence provides a testimonial as to how EEP can work in the best interest of the profession and the public – as a nonpunitive, complementary process of the BON’s regulatory efforts.

“I tried to call you today to tell you thank you for all your help during my testing period. I appreciate you and am grateful that I can go forward with my life now! I graduate Saturday and will be back in school in January working towards my master’s degree for nurse practitioner. May you have a blessed holiday season!”

Q. How may I contact EEP?

A. By telephone toll-free: (866) 673-6721; email: tpapn@texasnurses.org; or via US Postal Service at: EEP, P.O. Box 9885, Austin, TX 78766. EEP itself cannot determine if a nurse can participate in the program. The BON must make that determination. Following approval, nurses must still meet all necessary criteria for participation. Self-referrals desiring to participate in EEP can contact the BON Enforcement Department directly: (512) 305-6838.

Q. I have concerns about a nurse who I believe has a drug/alcohol problem that has yet to reach the level of practice impairment. What should I do?

A. Dealing constructively with a nurse who has a possible substance abuse problem is not easy, especially when the nurse has not recognized a problem. Normally one should not try to intervene alone in this circumstance because the individual’s psychological and physical need for the drug may render one’s efforts ineffective. Typically, a well organized group intervention that includes concerned colleagues and significant others may help to break the denial associated with substance abuse and dependency and facilitate the individual obtaining needed assessment.

Consult with your nurse manager, the employee assistance professional (EAP), human resource representative of your facility, or TPAPN for guidance, as soon as feasible regarding possible resources and how you and others may work constructively for the sake of the nurse, the nurse’s patients, colleagues, and family. Substance use disorders are chronic,

progressive, and potentially fatal. Inaction is the worst thing that can happen for the nurse in question.

If a practice violation is suspected related to possible substance abuse, contact the BON in order to fulfill one’s reporting requirements: Ph: (512) 305-7400; Fax: (512) 305-7401. To obtain the appropriate BON complaint form online go to: www.bon.state.tx.us/about/complaint.html. The BON reviews all third party referrals to determine if it is appropriate for the nurse to have the opportunity to participate in TPAPN.

CANDACE RUTH COBB

On or about May 27, 2010, Candace Ruth Cobb submitted a Texas Online Examination Application for vocational nurse to the office of the Board and was issued a temporary permit to practice. Also received was a copy of a Diploma from a college in Corsicana, Texas, which was not the school Ms. Cobb listed for her education. This document was later reported to be fraudulent. On July 20, 2010, the Board office received an Affidavit of Graduation from a school in Hanford, California. This document was also fraudulent. The document contained a forged signature, and the Board received verification that Ms. Cobb did not attend or complete a nursing program from the school.



In addition, Ms. Cobb submitted an application for employment as a GVN to a long term care facility in Corsicana, Texas, and indicated that she graduated from a college in Dallas, Texas. On August 17, 2010, Ms. Cobb secured employment as a GVN and worked with the facility until September 15, 2010, when she was terminated. The temporary permit issued to Candace Ruth Cobb was rescinded and she was denied licensure by examination. The case was referred to the Travis County District Attorney's Office, Austin, Texas.

New Rules for Refresher Programs Take Effect

On October 11, 2010, the Board adopted new rules related to individuals who were seeking to reactivate their nursing license after being away from nursing for four or more years. The new rules serve to strengthen re-entry requirements in order to ensure a nurse is sufficiently competent to begin practicing again. These new requirements can be found in Board Rules 217.6, Failure to Renew a License and 217.9, Inactive Status. The applications for the Six-Month Temporary Permit in Vocational and Professional Nursing reflect the changes in the rules and will assist applicants seeking relicensure with the step-by-step reactivation process.

While most of the two rules and application processes remain the same, a few important changes occurred. Highlights of these changes are: applicants will be required to submit a course completion form from any of the following: (1) a Board approved nursing jurisprudence and ethics course, (2) the online Texas Board of Nursing Jurisprudence Prep Course, or (3) the Texas Board of Nursing jurisprudence and ethics workshop. In addition, applicants will be required to submit a certificate of completion of the Texas Nursing Jurisprudence Exam. Another important change is in the course content and recommendations for the percentage of time to be spent in each of these content areas. Documentation of current cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certification prior to beginning precepted clinical experiences is now required. Refresher Program Providers will have until August 31, 2011 to comply with the new rules.

Applicants are still required to apply for a Six-Month Temporary Permit to complete a refresher course, an extensive orientation, or a nursing program of study. Additionally, applicants must meet all the requirements of the didactic and clinical learning experiences prior to submitting a reactivation application, any applicable fees, and evidence of completion of 20 contact hours of acceptable continuing nursing education in the two years immediately preceding the application for reactivation.

Board staff has developed a Frequently Asked Question (FAQ) and a convenient Reactivation Checklist for applicants to help clarify the new rules. The documents are contained within the Six-Month Temporary Permit Applications for LVN and RNs and are available on the Board's website, under **Verification and Licensing**, then **Download Other Paper Applications and Forms**.
